

- ★ Ensure that all allegations of abuse and/or neglect in Texas Mental Health Mental Retardation (TxMHMR) residential and outreach programs are promptly and effectively investigated.
- Regulate all child care facilities as required by law, to reduce the risk of serious injury, abuse, and communicable disease to children in these facilities.
