















Average Length of Time in Months Children are in Temporary Substitute Care Until Placed in a Permanent Living Arrangement by Region






Permanency Goal of Children in Substitute Care for Whom PRS Has Legal Responsibility August 1997






Children Placed in Adoptive Homes by Region During Fiscal Year 1997




Characteristics of Children Placed in Adoption During Fiscal Year 1997











Abuse and/or neglect recidivism at any time after initial contact by PRS for all cases open or closed.




Average Length of Time in Months for Service by Stage of Service for CPS Cases Closed by Region



The Preparation for Adult Living (PAL) program was implemented to ensure that older youths in substitute care are prepared for their inevitable departure from the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services' care and support. The PAL program's goal is to provide each of these youths with the skills and resources they will need to be a productive adult. Youths in the PAL program receive training in personal and interpersonal skills, job skills, money management, housing and transportation, health, and planning for the future. Transitional living allowances and household supplies stipends are provided. Additional services with funding availability, include specialized camps, vocational assessments, training, and supplies. Youth become eligible for PAL services at age 14. Youths 16 and older who are residing in PRS paid substitute care must be provided PAL services.
