Legislative Update: Kristene Blackstone

58 enrolled CPS Bills this session, 28 have implementation plans

House Bill 53

Revamps Transitional Living Services Program's financial literacy educations.

House Bill 72

Requires HHSC to ensure that children with adoption assistance Medicaid or PCA remain enrolled in STAR health during transition.

House Bill 1884

Ensure DFPS communicates to relative/caregivers how to pursue licensing/foster care benefits.

House Bill 3390

Ensure children/youth are being asked who safe adults in their lives are to gain additional potential placements.

Senate Bill 355

Requires DFPS to develop a strategic plan for coordinated implementation of CBC.

Senate Bill 781

Directs DFPS developing and establishing strategy for runaway children.

House Bill 1 General Appropriations Act: David Kinsey

Appropriations from session:

- APS and SWI received raises
- CBC
- Provider rate increases; Emergency Shelters, SIL, CPA
- CPS obtained critical client services staff
- DFPS obtained additional contract staff
- PEI increases in HOPES and Nurse Family Partnership programs

Update from Region 2 (21Ngage): Michael Patrick and Michael Redden

- No children have been without placement since start of serving children.
- Generally placing children within Region 2. Next goal is to focus on the 50 mile marker.

- 95 new foster homes since January 1, 2019, net gain of 50.
- Added 3 Arrow Treatment Foster Care Program.
- Expanding temporary emergency placements with Caring Hearts.

Update from Region 3b (ACH/OCOK): Wayne Carson

- Stage II Preparation
 - Communication was done very quickly to DFPS staff related to Legislative appropriations for CBC.
 - o Dr. Carson (ACH) and George Cannata (DFPS RD) developed and release a video to 3b CPS staff and went around 3b to hold meetings with CPS staff.
- Region 3b SSCC quarter 3 performance shared.

Discussion: Clarification that FBSS is not currently a part of CBC.

Update from Region 8a (Family Tapestry): Annette Rodriguez

- 900 placements since February
 - o Targeted capacity for older, higher needs youth.
 - o Everyone doing their part to sustain higher needs children.
- Trainings
 - o A&M training providers.
- HR Initiative
 - o Three month initiative to target successful foster parents of higher needs children/youth.
 - Youth who have been in these successful homes were interviewed to determine what was working well.

QIC-AG Project Update: Kaysie Taccetta

State of Texas determined an intervention plan; Pathway to Permanence. It was selected due to many short term and long term evidence based outcomes.

Catchment Areas

- Region 1 SSCC contract awarded to St. Francis Community Services in Texas, Inc. in June 2019.
- Region 8b RFA was released on May 2, 2019 and will close August 2, 2019.

Data Access and Standards Governance Council:

- Continue progress towards establishing a two-way data exchange between CPS and SSCC systems
 - Testing with ACH/OCOK underway

o Focusing on SSCC referral for paid placement and short form of application for placement

Request for Information:

Released on May 30th and closed June 30th
